Come Celebrate Carl Pate's Meet-n-Greet

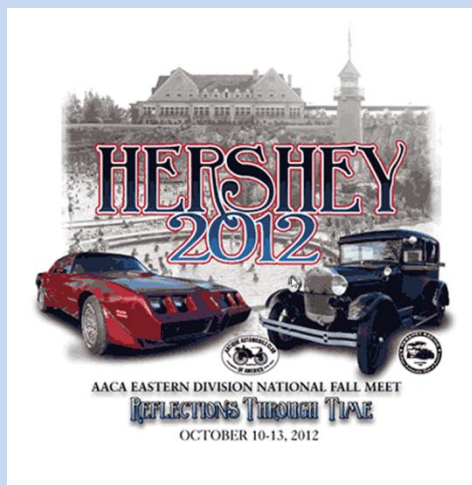
