

The Fordmobile

We have at last succeeded in finding the automobile which meets the SPECIAL DEMAND for something between a run-about and a heavy touring car. On discovering this car, we at once secured the sale of it for this territory. This is the FORDMOBILE.

IT is manufactured in Detroit by one of the best known makers of motor vehicles. The Fordmobile derives its name from being the crowning achievement of Mr. Henry B. Ford, who has been identified with gas engine and automobile construction since 1901. He will be remembered as the builder of the famous "999" which holds the world's speed record won by Tom Cooper at Detroit.

It was also Mr. Ford who built the machine which holds the world's championship for 24 miles on a circular track.


What the Fordmobile is
It is an 4-horsepower car. The motor is of a double-valved, water-cooled type; has four bore by four stroke cylinders with the water jacket and head are cast in one piece, thus avoiding packed joints. It has a special timing device, automatic throughout, "open heart" steel crank shaft, and phosphor-bronze bearings.

The Transmission Gear
Of the Fordmobile is a special feature, being run in oil and rendering the machine exceedingly reliable. In appearance it is very stylish, and the finish is of the highest grade. It is one of the most comfortable and easy riding carriages ever built.
